


Two decades of pension reforms

Average effective labour market exit age, EU-28 by gender, 1970-2016






Automatic adjustment mechanisms



Automatic mechanisms in public pension system in the EU



Pensions: huge ageing challenge - policies work, but reform reversal risks are present




Towards a risk-based approach
